Mary's Book Corner

VERITAS A Harvard Professor, A con Man and the Gospel of Jesus's Wife



by Ariel Sabar, an award winning journalist.

I really became engaged with the book when I realized how much he was using good genealogical research techniques to discover just who the con man was. Starting with just a few facts, a general place where the con man lived and a couple of names with specific dates that he used in an attempt to authenticate an ancient papyrus, Sabar made good use of Elizabeth Shown Mills' F.A.N. club. He tracked down minute details of the con man's Friends, Associates, and Neighbors over a period of four years in order to solve the mystery. It takes 35 pages of tiny type to list all of his sources and another five pages for the bibliography. It is a fascinating and cautionary tale of how documents of all sorts can be forged and if not detected as such, may have the effect of changing history.

RESEARCHING CENSUS RECORDS

The National Genealogy Society publishes a quarterly magazine with articles about genealogy and genealogy research. The fourth issue of this publication for 2021 focuses on census records.

In **April of 2022, the 1950 census** will become public. This issue includes an article with information on taking the census (the largest ever taken), the types of questions asked, searching the census by location, and a comparison of other years.

Other articles include: The Evolution of US Census Instructions: 1790-1870, Locating Hard-to-Find Census Entries, Using Social Statistics Schedules to Learn About Ancestral Communities, and Mortality Schedules: Death Records Before State Registration.

Additional articles cover finding free online newspapers and a detailed article about holding successful virtual meetings.

NGS is a valuable resource for genealogy researchers. Issues for 2021 are available at the NVGS library.

FamilySearch Completes Digitization of

Massive Microfilm Collection

SALT LAKE CITY, UT—It is a milestone 83 years in the making.

In September, FamilySearch International announced the completion of a massive project to digitize its collection of millions of rolls of microfilm containing billions of family history records from around the world. The archive containing information on more than 11.5 billion individuals is now freely available to the public on *FamilySearch.org*.

To explore FamilySearch's free collections of indexed records and images, go to <u>FamilySearch.org</u> and search both "Records" and "Images". The Images feature enables users to peruse digitized images from the microfilm collection and more. A free FamilySearch account will be required to access the service.

FamilySearch is committed to collecting, preserving, and providing access to the world's genealogical records to help individuals and families worldwide discover and connect with their family histories. FamilySearch will continue to increase the digitization of new records worldwide from its digital camera operations and partnerships. It will also begin digitizing 335,000 microfiches in its collections.

Some of these images will continue to be restricted by contract restraints from original owners but since we are an Affiliate library, most of the restricted records will be available to our patrons.

THE SOUL OF THE FAMILY TREE: Upcoming Zoom Talk

On Thursday, December 2, at 7:00 pm, author Lori Erickson will share life-changing insights gained from traveling in the footsteps of her Viking ancestors and her poor farming relatives in Norway and rural lowa. Erickson's latest book, *The Soul of the Family Tree:* Ancestors, Stories, and the Spirits We Inherit, has take-aways for all of us. In the chapter titled Badly Behaving Relatives, she cautions those who seek to learn more about their ancestors:

"Genealogy... makes it difficult to claim the moral high ground. If we go far enough back, all of us have many examples of both the oppressed and the oppressor in our lineages."

"If you want to climb onto a perch from which you can judge the rest of the world's iniquity, in other words, then genealogy is not the hobby for you. Research on the twists and turns of our lineages reinforces the perennial truth that within all of us is the potential for good and evil. Given the right circumstances - economic hardship, war, disease, and famine - we too may compromise, cheat, or commit violence."

"When we ponder our family trees, some humility is required."


Other Genealogical Events
