

Jabber from Janíce

There are times when you just keep searching and searching on a website to no avail but yet you feel deep down that the information you are seeking is there. Here are some helpful hints from "Get a Leg Up" by Diane Haddad in the September 2007 Family Tree Magazine.

- Read the instructions! I know this seems obvious but often you will get great information on how this search will work the best. Sometimes an asterisk * will open up new ways to search but if you do not read instructions you will miss out.
- Boolean searches may be available to you. Boolean searches use the + (plus sign) to keep words together ("Tillman +Brown" would keep these words together instead of finding George Tillman and Allison Brown, it would find Tillman Brown); the (minus sign) to eliminate words (as for when I do a search on my Vest family, I would put in "-clothing" so I don't get the ads for vests to wear). There are more symbols available and reading the instructions (see above) should reveal them. Pay attention to where spaces go and where they don't.
- When doing a search that has lots of parameters, type in as much as you know (name, birth date, place, etc). If nothing helpful turns up, repeat the search with fewer terms, Likewise, you can begin the search with only the surname and add in information to limit the hits until you narrow down to only the hits you are interested in checking.
- Remember that a database site will only call up a searched ancestor's name if someone took the time to index that database using the same spelling and order that you may have entered. If you search on Edward Gillman and the indexer interpreted the information as Edward Gillman or Ed Gillman, you may not get what you would expect. Always try alternate spellings. Just because you know it is correctly spelled do not jump to the conclusion that the data was entered or interpreted correctly.
- On websites with multiple databases (such as FamilySearch.org or Ancestry.com), search the databases individually. The separate database search engines are different than the global search engine for the entire site. This will give you more targeted results. Just scroll to where you can click on the database you wish to search.
- Remember to go back often and search again. New information is constantly added. Lists may have been indexed that were not indexed before.
