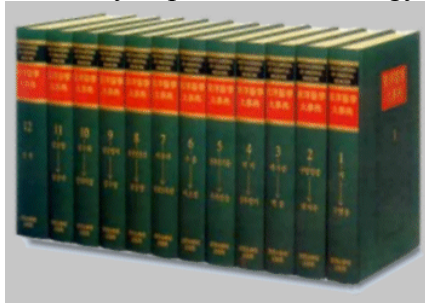

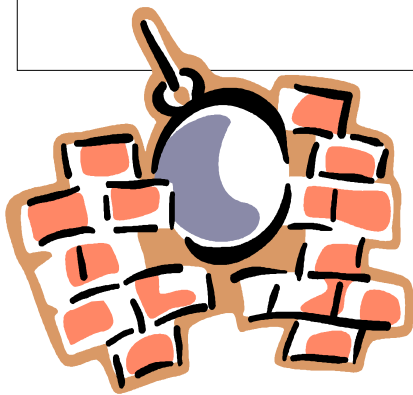

Hope you may be able to lead me in the right direction on my MOORE brick wall. Have been trying for several years to find the proper parents of one Robert Moore b. abt 1732/4, in Bristol Parish Prince George, VA married abt 1756/7, in Cumberland Co., VA and died in 1808/10 in Green Co., KY. I have his will made out in 1808, but probated in 1810. His wife was Susannah King Guthrie b. abt 1735/8, in King William Co., VA or Rockingham, VA. She died 3 June 1824, in Green Co., KY Her parents were Thomas Guthrie and Sarah Oakes. Robert and Susannah had eight children. I have been able to find others descended from the children doing research but no one has any idea of who the parents of Robert Moore are or where he came from. Speculation is parents were James Moore and Mary??? or a Thomas Moore. ANY suggestions would be a step forward.

Visiting the Everton Genealogical Collection

On my research trip to Salt Lake City in early October, I decided to visit the Everton Genealogical Collection. It's currently housed on city property in Logan, Utah. Since I had a bit of time in the area (eight days), it made sense to break up the trip with something different. I had been reading about the collection in genealogy magazines and online newsletters, and knew that I'd regret not making the effort. The materials that make up the archive were collected by the Everton family, during the long period of time they published *The Genealogical Helper*. Authors would send a copy of their works to be reviewed in the magazine. So, the books here are in good shape, having had very little use. There are also odds and ends of newsletters, unpublished manuscripts, surname notes, and small publications. It was the policy of the Everton not to pass judgment on materials, so they encouraged everything: scholarly works, self-published books with no documentation, and bundles of notes. All can be useful in some way.

I drove in a rental car from downtown Salt Lake City, north and east through Box Elder Canyon, to the beautiful Cache Valley and Logan. Although part of the local library system, the Everton Collection is housed at one end of the Justice Building, where court is held. This means there's a security check, so be prepared leave behind any gadgets that might not pass inspection, like pocket knives or scissors. Inside, the part of the building where the collection is located has a rather unfinished feel, with exposed insulation and the like. The librarian on duty that day, Jason Cornelius, had been most cordial in helping me to arrange my visit. He is the author of many of the magazine articles that appear about the collection. With a dedicated staff of volunteers, but a small budget, he is making headway in getting the place in shape.

When the collection was donated to the city, it wasn't organized in any fashion. The staff is still attempting to get the online catalog complete. It will become easier to assess whether a trip to the library will be of benefit, as more entries are made. My experience was that it was a pleasant journey, and a fun way to spend the afternoon, but I didn't seem to find any materials that wouldn't have been at the Family History Library in Salt Lake City. I cheerfully admit, however, that I may not have spent enough time combing through the card catalog ahead of time, or looking through the uncataloged filing cabinet full of surname folders.

A word of caution, doing this from Salt Lake City involves a 150-mile round trip, which is a pretty big gulp in one day, especially if you've already done some research in the morning. If I were pressed for time in SLC, I'd probably pass up the Everton Collection. The ideal way to see it would be if you could spend the night in Logan, or could stop on an RV trip. The library is generally open weekday afternoons from 1-6, except Mondays. It's open Tuesdays until 9:00, and one Saturday afternoon a month. June Program



“Celeste Campbell, R.N.: Her Professional Life Within its Historical Context” was the topic of the Power Pont presentation of Nancy Gilien and Anna Gentile.

Using family photographs and documents plus many historical images from a variety of sources the speakers alternated in telling the story of their mother’s history as a Red Cross nurse in Word War I and afterward as a public health nurse. During 1918 Campbell served in France as a surgical nurse with other Americans assigned to the British Expeditionary Forces caring for the wounded. Later in that year she nursed victims of the influenza pandemic. Finally, she worked in an evacuation hospital sending American wounded and former prisoners of war back to the States. She was discharged in 1919.

The presentation continued Celeste Campbell’s story as she was sponsored by the Red Cross to return to school to become a public health nurse. Assigned to a rural county in Arkansas and supported by citizens in the local Red Cross chapter she was the first public health nurse in the county. She provided service in five major areas. She went into the home to teach family members how to care for the sick. She became the nurse for the schools. She taught comprehensive classes in “Home Hygiene and Care of the Sick”, and used a variety of methods to improve health education and sanitation. She worked extensively to improve the health and nutrition of women and children. She assisted veterans to obtain health and rehabilitation services.

The value of public health nursing service was proved by the fact that the county in 1927 established the tax supported public health program which continues to this day. The Red Cross Chapter is still active with a variety of programs focused on disaster/relief services.

The audience was responsive and appreciative of the presentation.

Nancy and Anna were awarded the Lucille Westbrook Prize for the best manuscript article on local Arkansas history. The award was given by the Arkansas Historical Association at its annual meeting in April, 2007, and consisted of a certificate with a check for \$1000.00.

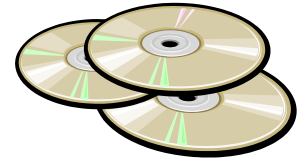
