"AHNENTAFELS AND COLLATERALS by the Numbers," by William Dollarhide
(Genealogy Pointers, 1-15-08)

In the Genealogy Pointers article, "An Awful Ahnentafel" (Genealogy Pointers, 12-04-07), Mr. Dollarhide explains the very useful German numbering system for a pedigree. The ID numbers (or ahnentafel numbers) that allow a genealogist to have unique numbers, which can be used as controlling devices and for organizing a pedigree in different ways--for making lists of ancestors, surnames, or even families. NUMBERING FAMILY SHEETS

For every pair of ancestors on a pedigree chart or ancestor table, you need to prepare a family group sheet. A rule in genealogy is to treat the brothers and sisters of our ancestors as equals--that is, we need to gather sources and records about the siblings as if they were direct ancestors. (By coincidence, the siblings have the same set of parents as your ancestors).

Dollarhide's Rule #1: Treat the brothers and sisters of your ancestor as equals--even if some of them were in jail.

Genealogists understand that the place where a family lived is critical information in locating contemporary sources. In some cases, it may be necessary to identify siblings, their spouses, their children, their grandchildren, or more--and hopefully locate a relative alive today who can share information about your common ancestor.

The ID numbers for each ancestor can be used for identifying the position of a particular family group sheet (FGS) in numerical order. For example, the first group sheet in a notebook might be for number 2 and number 3 (the father and mother of number 1). The first FGS can be identified as "2/3," indicating the father/mother ID numbers, followed by group sheets for each pair from a pedigree chart:

2/3 (father is 2, mother is 3)

4/5 (father is 4, mother is 5)

6/7 (father is 6, mother is 7)

8/9 (father is 8, mother is 9)

10/11 (father is 10, mother 11)

12/13 (father is 12, mother 13)

14/15 (Father is 14, mother is 15)

and so on

With this arrangement, the ID numbers identify the pedigree position of each family sheet. The sheets can be organized in a notebook numerically rather than alphabetically by surname. (In an alphabetical arrangement, it's quite possible, when several unrelated families share the same surname, that ancestral and collateral families will be arranged together when, in fact, they are not related at all.)

But the real advantage to organizing family sheets in numerical order arises when there are many "extra" families. A family group sheet becomes a tremendous tool in understanding the places where an ancestor and each sibling were born, married, or died. It is necessary to have more choices for research on the parents by drawing from information about each of the siblings.

Mary designed a special vest with pockets for digital camera, palm book and key board, GPS, flashlight, coins, telephone, and other items. When she visited a library or court house, there was no need for a purse.

Their journey was highly successful. The reunion was most enjoyable. Mary found the sites that she had planned to visit. Unexpectedly, at one place she recognized her mother in a group picture. This was a touching bonus.

Finally, Mary and Michael prepared a complete printed report, the
"Great Motoring Adventure of 2007"

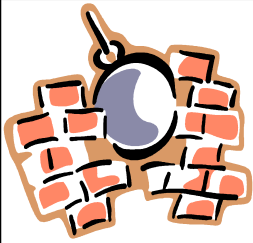
The audience was appreciative, delighted and had many questions.

Now, the site charged for the data but you did get to search the index before you needed to pay the fee for the record. With a little sleuthing, you could be fairly certain of downloading the correct information. You can bet I will be doing more research in the Parrish records for Inniscarra, County Cork.

Book Review:

My husband found a very interesting book for me; *By Faith Alone, One Family's Epic Journey Through 400 Years of American Protestantism*. The title sounds very scholarly but it is extremely readable and very down to earth. The author, Bill Griffeth, CNBC-TV anchor, skillfully weaves the story of his own four-hundred-year family history with the evolution of Protestantism in America. Genealogists will find it fascinating although the Library of Congress somehow missed classifying under the subject Genealogy. They only listed it as Church History, Protestantism, United States.



It all started with an eight generation family tree sent to Griffeth by a cousin. He became quite intrigued when he realized that an eight times great-grandmother had been one of the Salem "witches". He then set out to verify the facts and to provide details about the various family members. He traveled extensively to visit sites where they lived, both here and in Europe. He researched the historical events, particularly the religious ones, that influenced their lives. He shares the resources and techniques that he used.

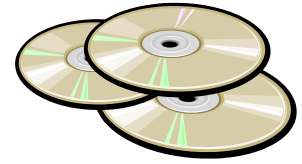

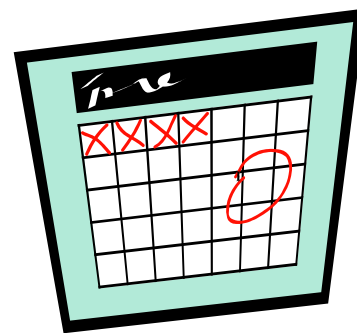
