A Message from our President

The May 21, 2009 meeting of the Napa Genealogy Society will be an open house at our Library celebrating our 35th anniversary. The Napa Valley Genealogical and Biographical Society was established in July of 1974 as an offshoot of the Napa County Bicentennial Commission. Marian McGuire, our first president, donated the first books to our library and played an important role in getting the Society registered as a tax exempt educational organization. Marian continued to serve on the Board of Directors and held many offices over the years. She was active in our Society until her death in 2000. Marian was also active in other organizations, such as the Native Daughters of the Golden West and the Daughters of the American Revolution.

Our Society began with four meetings per year and quickly expanded to monthly meetings. Workshops and seminars were held, and in 1984 we hosted the National Genealogical Society Conference in the States with attendance of over 1,000 from around the country. Our Library began in the Native Sons Hall and moved to rented quarters on Solano Ave. before we purchased our building at 1701 Menlo Ave. in 1989. Today we have over 6,000 books and publications, and we are considered one of the finest Libraries north of San Francisco.

For our annual Wine Drawing, we have been collecting wines from the donor wineries, and we now have over 50 bottles of wine for our first prize. Members will be receiving their raffle tickets in the mail in June and our drawing will be on Thursday, August 20, 2009 at the Napa Senior Center. We will need volunteers to sell the raffle tickets at the Napa Valley Wine Train Station and a signup sheet will be available at the Library. We hope you will be able to support our annual fund raising effort.

Our Library will be closed on Independence Day, Saturday, July 4, 2009. We have been trying to keep the Library open every Saturday but we need additional volunteers to do this.

WRITING GROUP

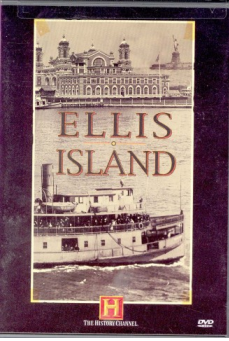

March Program



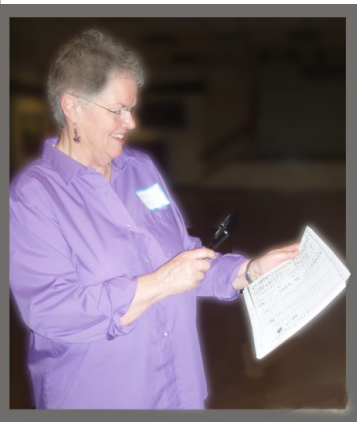
The immigrant experience upon arrival at Ellis Island was vividly portrayed in the film produced by the History Channel and shown at the March meeting of the Napa Valley Genealogical and Biographical Society.

Immigrants arriving via first or second class passage and presumably self supporting, were quickly interviewed and cleared by the custom authorities. Steerage class passengers, on the other hand, were carefully screened to prevent their becoming a financial or health burden on the United States..

Although the situation in the huge reception hall on the island seemed to be chaotic, in actuality there was a very well organized process from registration to physical and mental examinations to final dismissal. Records of each person and family were maintained in depth and detail. A large hospital was maintained on the island, and many patients of all ages were treated there. However, the many graves on the grounds attested to the fact that all did not recover.

Assisted by many volunteers speaking various languages the immigrants received guidance and assistance through out their time on Ellis Island. Alas, a number were found unfit and were turned away.

CD REVIEW

Early New England Settlers, 1600s-1800s

The lineages, family histories, immigration records, vital records, and historical sketches included on this Family Archive CD contain information on approximately 190,000 individuals. Originally published by GPC, the 21 titles reproduced here are the bedrock of New England genealogy, comprising many of the most celebrated books ever published on the subject--books like *One Hundred and Sixty Allied Families* by John Osborne Austin and *Genealogical Register of the First Settlers of New England* by John Farmer.

Coming Up – Annual Fund Raiser

Each slot requires about one and one-half hour of your time. The times are 10-11:30 in the morning and 5-6:30 in the evening. Signup sheets will be available at the library and at our monthly program. Members have found the volunteer service an interesting one, offering an opportunity to meet and greet visitors to the valley.

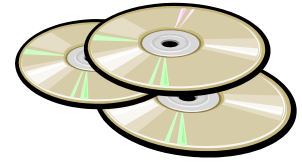
History of the IRS

DID YOUR ANCESTORS QUALIFY?

President Abraham Lincoln and Congress enacted a tax in 1862 to help pay Civil War expenses, creating a position called commissioner of Internal Revenue.

Wyoming ratified the 16th Amendment in 1913, meaning enough states made it possible to amend the Constitution, giving Congress the authority to enact income taxes.

The first Form 1040 was introduced in 1913. It emerged after Congress levied a tax on net personal income. It included a 1 percent tax on incomes of more than \$3,000.

“Show and Tell” was the topic of the April program at the Senior Center.



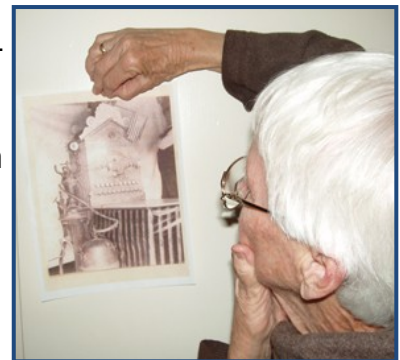
Members were invited to bring a genealogical treasure to share with the group. Nell Dunn displayed a beautiful quilt begun in 1939 by her mother Gertrude. The plan was to have each block filled in by relatives, but the work was never finished. Nell resumed the project in 1990, mailing blocks to relatives for filling with the names of her mother's female descendants and daughters-in-law. On the back of the quilt are the names of female descendants of her two grandmothers.



In the four corners are the names and ship symbols of her four great grandmothers. Members marveled at the beauty and remarkable preservation of this unique heirloom.

Nancy Gilien brought a mystery picture seeking help in the identification of the object in the very old photograph found in her grandfather's bible. An American flag can be faintly seen, and the number of its stars dates the picture probably no earlier than 1912. The grandfather died in 1918.

Many suggestions were made as to what the odd contraption might be – from a still to a soda fountain dispenser. But the picture remains an unsolved mystery.



Carole Fisher believes that persistence pays off. She knew that there were photographs of her husband's family somewhere, but multiple inquiries to relatives and in-laws over several years time span did not bring them to light. Finally, a cousin of her husband knew someone, a sister-in-law, whose elderly mother had a family album. And there it was – wonderful pictures with additional information about many family members. The picture is of Carole standing by the display case at the public library where information about the Napa Valley Genealogical & Biographical Society was presented last October. Her hand points to her prized family bible on the middle shelf.

It was a delightful evening of sharing.
