

The San Joaquin Genealogical Society's library is housed at the Stockton/San Joaquin Public Library, Cesar Chavez Central Branch, 605 North El Dorado Street, Stockton, California, 95202. Their website is: http://www.stockton.lib.ca.us/chavez/

There is no specific Genealogy subcategory on the library website but using keyword quick search with the term Genealogy along with San Joaquin County helped narrow my search to specific items, mostly publications of the Genealogy Society.

<u>http://www.sanjoaquinhistory.org/</u> is the website for the San Joaquin County Historical Society. The Historical Society maintains an archival collection on behalf of the County. This includes historic records as well as books, manuscripts, business and legal records, maps, photographs and ephemera pertaining to the history of the County.

This website had a "Research" link that lead to some special collections. On one is "Genealogical Research" that leads to an OAC (Online Archive of California) website http://www.oac.cdlib.org/ that includes pdf digitized items.

I know I have mentioned this before but I need to say it again.

Check the https://familysearch.org/ website. It has a new updated look. You can now choose a very specific collection and then do a search in that collection or you can search a specific time frame. You can do a broad search or narrow it down as appropriate if too many hits are unearthed. You will notice that the IGI (International Genealogical Index) is no longer a separate database to search. You can access that information in the general search. The member submitted LDS Family Tree information is not currently available as it is undergoing an overhaul and will soon be available in a lineage searchable tree format. On the main page are links to the Blog which is well worth checking. Also notice that there is an opportunity to volunteer time indexing. It can be done from home while still in your jammies. No special skills are required. Volunteer when you have time. Just register, sign in, and follow the easy steps shown below:

Select a batch of 10-50 records to download Copy key information from the record to your computer Submit the information you have copied back to FamilySearch

What Our Ancestors Died Of

ague - any of several feverish conditions, e.g., malaria (not so odd when you remember how many seamen visited tropical ports in the age of sail, and contracted illnesses)

bad blood - euphemism for venereal disease, especially syphilis

bilious fever - any of hepatitis, malaria, typhoid (caused by bacteria salmonella)

bladder in the throat - diphtheria

carbuncle - large boil (not usually fatal); skin cancer (then often fatal)

consumption - tuberculosis

cramp colic - appendicitis, peritonitis; also simply "colic"

debility - lack of energy or movement, probably due to an unrecognized illness

dentition - teething (hard to imagine this as fatal in itself; probably other complications)

dropsy - congestive heart failure; also noted as "hydrothorax"

falling sickness - epilepsy

flux - diarrhea; hemorrhage

gleet - inflamed membrane in the urethra

green sickness - anemia

horrors - delirium tremens

infantile paralysis - poliomyletis

jail fever, ship fever - typhus (caused by bacteria rickettsia)

king's evil - tuberculosis in the neck and lymph glands; also called **scrofula** (until Queen Anne, monarchs actually touched the afflicted; popular belief was that the king's touch cured it)

milk fever - children contracted this bacterial disease from milk from cows having brucellosis mortification - gangrene (common before antiseptics)

nostalgia - homesickness; the belief that immigrants died pining for their native land

old age - applied to people as young as 55 (making some of us positively "ancient")

palsy - paralysis; also uncontrollable jerking of limbs; also entered as "fits"

screws - rheumatism

senility - advanced old age; perhaps Alzheimer's; wrongly applied to young people **visitation by God** - many sudden deaths due to natural causes, e.g, strokes, were called this

1940 Census Will be Free on Ancestry.com

Subscription genealogy website *Ancestry.com* has decided to make the 1940 census images and index-which will be on the site after the 1940 census is opened next year for research-<u>free to search and view through 2012</u>. That'll be more than 3.8 million images with 130 million records. Even better, **They'll be indexed by 45 fields**, meaning you'll be able to search on the name, street address, county, state, parents' birthplaces and more. The records won't be on Ancestry.com right when the census is released April 2, 2012. Ancestry.com's press release says they'll commence "streaming onto the website in mid' April 2012." Can't wait until mid-April? The record images will be available first on the National Archives' website, but they won't be searchable right away.
