## Jabber from Janice

2013! Wow, how did we get to this year so quickly? Speaking of time passing, this article will review some sites for newspapers which assist genealogists in the events in their ancestors' lives.



#### http://chroniclingamerica.loc.gov/

This is a free site from the Library of Congress using the newspaper collection of over 4.8 million pages from 1836 to 1922 (and earlier but these have not yet been digitized). You can search by state and year or do an advanced search for specific papers. Opening page allows you to enter a state and time frame (default is the entire range available), then you can add any term you wish (a surname or city or event). After results appear, you can sort by title of paper. I had over 500 and by quickly scanning the group, I could eliminate newspapers that I thought would not be useful. The surnames (I added 2) were highlighted in red as well as pages searched which made the search easier. Since my mouse has a wheel, I scrolled to enlarge the pages and holding down the left button gave the user the ability to move the page around.

#### http://www.newspaperabstracts.com/

This is also free and has over 94,000 pages of historical newspapers. This site has articles contributed for searching. It is more limited but you might hit the jackpot. You can search by country, state and county to see the newspaper articles. A short synopsis is posted. When viewing the article, you can use the Find option from your internet browser to search for a specific surname. The article I looked at was transcribed and not a digitized image but it primarily listed the articles on birth, marriage, death (must have been done by a geneal-ogist). They were easily searched. I found myself reading the whole article as it was in an area that I had lots of interest.

#### www.genealogybank.com

This is a subscription site that specializes in old newspapers with over 600 million articles. I signed up for a 30 day trial. After the trial it is \$5.83 a month for a year subscription. At the end of the 30 days the trial is over and a phone call must be made in order to avoid the subscription charge. I was successful with several items. One was an obituary for my grandmother in The Riverside Daily Press. She had died in Stockton and lived in Tracy but her daughter lived in Riverside as well as several relatives named in the obit who lived in that area.. Good find!

Many state websites are also free and include newspaper collections. Also library websites often have newspaper collections that have been digitized. Most require a library card that some will issue without an in person visit. With that card, you will be able to access their database collection from home.

#### http://www.freenewspaperarchives.us/

This is a comprehensive site that has links to holdings at various locations. Newspapers are listed by state, most at libraries or state archives. Searching on the various site location requires patience as each is different, some easier to use than others. Worth checking.

#### http://cdnc.ucr.edu/cdnc/

The California Digital Newspaper Collection which is a freely accessible repository of digitized California newspapers from 1846 to the present. Searching can be done in a specific newspaper. These digitized pages are also in the Library of Congress project. Work is done by volunteers. See how you can help on the website.

#### freegreenlibrary.newspaperarchive.com

This site appears to be a free sampling of the newspaperarchive.com site. Easily searched site with lots of pages with a few newspapers. You may get lucky. A trial membership on the http://newspaperarchive.com/will give you access to one of the largest collections of newspapers. An introductory subscription for a year is available for \$19.95. I have not tried this site but have heard it is impressive. If a "find" is saved as a pdf, it can be read very clearly and saved on your computer. I plan to test it out.

#### Mary's Book Corner

I just finished reading **Ryan Littrell's Reunion: a Search for Ancestors**. I had a hard time putting this book down but I must confess that I skipped over most of the chapters on Scottish history in order to get to the exciting part - finding those elusive ancestors! Littrell had never done any family research until an old letter happened to fall into his hands and his quest to understand it and find the people mentioned in it became almost an obsession. At first I was a little put off by the ease with which he managed to get back from one generation to the next and his seeming ability to travel at the drop of a hat and to hire experts along the way to help him. It reminded me of the TV show, *Who Do You Think You Are*, that made family research look so easy. But then I realized that if he could find where in Kentucky his Pike County Missouri William McDonald came from in the 1830s, then I might just have a chance of finding where in Kentucky my Pike County George Johnson came from. I'm going to go back and study his technique more closely!
