WORLDCAT (too good not to share from Tracy Area Genealogy Society): http://www.oclc.org/worldcat/

WorldCat is a free catalog of 1.5 billion items at more than 10,000 libraries worldwide. This is a global catalog of library collection and a wonderful tool for locating books, manuscripts, microfilms and other family history resources. WorldCat does not cover the catalogs of the Family History Library. Once you find the item you will have several options to access it. WorldCat automatically identifies your location and tells you the closest library that holds each item. If you can't visit the library, you can use Inter Library Loan (this service is for free or at a small cost per item), but first check with Google Books, http://www.books.google.com and the Internet Archive, http://www.archive.org to see if you can find the item for free.

A few tricks in using WorldCat:

- Search on a last name plus the word *family* to find genealogy related materials. You can add places they lived in in quotations (just like using Google) for exact phrases and hits.
- Catalog descriptions don't usually list every name mentioned in the book but usually just the most prominent ones.
- Search on the name of a town, county, or state plus the word *history* to find local histories.
- To locate indexes, abstracts and transcriptions of local records, search on a place name along with the word *genealogy*.
- If you're searching for a specific item, click on Advanced Search. You can also limit matches to just manuscripts by selecting Archival Material as the Format.

Mary's Book Corner

Middling Folk: Three Seas, Three Centuries, One Scots-Irish Family by Linda H. Matthews is a fascinating look at one "middling" family; no heroes no famous people; actually, there is nothing much to distinguish them from any other family. However, this family's journey from Scotland to Ireland and finally

the colonies has been meticulously researched and many types of records discovered, enough to make any genealogist envious. When the author laments not being able to find enough details to satisfy her desire to flesh out the people, she confesses that her historian side puts down her pen and she allows her novelist side to imagine how and why a particular event happened. It is a very effective way to deal with the story of a family over a very long period of time.

From our shelves: a BOOK REVIEW

Abstracts of Wills, Inventories and Administration Accounts of Frederick County, Virginia, 1743-1800 Compiled by J.E. King

The probate records, which comprise the bulk of this work, cover the period 1743 to 1800. Data provided in the abstracts include the name of the testator, dates of instrument and probate, names of spouse, children and other family members, names of executors and witnesses, and detailed references to the disposition of the estate. It also includes the Rent Roll of 1746, cemetery inscriptions (Winchester), a brief list of survey warrants, and an index of approximately 5000 entries.
