#### Rreview FAMILY SEARCH

As part of FamilySearch's plan to discontinue the microfilm loan program, they offered the ability to access restricted records to affiliate libraries like ours. What does that mean for our patrons?

When you search for a specific record collection your results are marked by icons denoting availability. A book icon means you will have to go to Salt Lake City to read it in the library there. A film reel means it is only available on microfilm and again you will have to go to Salt Lake. A camera icon means that it has been digitized and is available on the website. Some camera icons have a key above it and that means it is restricted to viewing at a family history center or an affiliate library. Now when you are searching on one of the computers in our library, you will not see the key and you will be able to access the record. There are still some records with further restrictions concerning how many people can view it at a time. I have one record that I have been trying to consult but every time I bring it up, someone else is using it. Patience is a virtue, patience is a virtue.



# First Vintage Fashion Show a Success

NVGS's first-ever vintage fashion show, "Have Bag, Will Travel" was a tremendous success. Member Dorothy Streich emailed an enthusiastic summary of the event: "It was fun." "The room was beautiful." "The fashion show was wonderful." "What a great idea." These were just some of the comments from people on the way out.'





Photos provided by Goodwill of the Greater East Bay got us a full page spread *in The Napa Valley Register*. The newspaper also sent a photographer/reporter to the fashion show. He stayed for the entire show, taking photos of the models and interviewing the coordinator. The result was an article on the front page of the newspaper.

The event raised \$4,450 after expenses which included \$400 for the rental of the Native Sons Hall and \$600 to Goodwill of the Greater East Bay for the models, clothes and commentator. The proceeds will be used to help cover operating expenses for the library.

The board reviewed the event at its April meeting. There was support for holding the event again next year. Improvements that were discussed included using a larger venue or selling few tickets and raising the ticket price.





# A Step Back In Time

It turns out that calling the recent vintage fashion show the "first ever" for NVGS is not accurate. According to clippings and photographs found in the library's archives, "The Way We Wore" was a major fundraising event for the Napa Valley Genealogical and Biographical Society and Library in the spring of 1986.

The fashion show was produced by Pleasant Hill resident Jan Chase, whose hobby was collecting vintage fashions. It was held at the Clarion Inn on Solano Avenue and included lunch for \$20. The fashions modeled in the show included a 1920's swimsuit, a 1950's cheerleader's uniform and a 1917 nurse's uniform. Life member Diane Dillon wore her grandmother's driving duster.
