

Come and learn from Curt Witcher, Director of Special Collection at the Allen County Library in Fort Wayne, In., how to use the Allen County Public Library Genealogy Center and then how to use Periodical Literature.

Session 1: Effective Use of the Allen County Public Library Genealogy Center

Providing a detailed description of the holdings of the Historical Genealogy Department of the Allen County Public Library, this lecture folds research methodology into an exploration of the resources of the nation's second largest genealogical research facility. Consideration is given not only to materials available for research on-site but also to how researchers can access data about the collection remotely.

**Session 2:** Mining the Mother Lode: Using Periodical Literature for Genealogical Research

Extremely significant quantities of family and local history data are published in the newsletters, journals, quarterlies, and magazines of the world's historical and genealogical societies. Yet, so many genealogists leave periodical literature untouched when conducting their research and investigating secondary sources of data. This lecture identifies the major types of periodical literature, what indices are available and how they can be most effectively used, and where one can find specific publications. Special attention is given to the Periodical Source Index as the largest and most comprehensive subject index in the genealogical field.

Learning to use indirect evidence can help you solve tough research problems and become a much better genealogist. In this presentation, Tristan will share case studies in which indirect evidence was the key to solving the case.

Tristan L. Tolman, AG is a professional genealogist, author, editor, and publisher. She has a bachelor's degree in Family History and Genealogy from Brigham Young University and is accredited in the U.S. Mid-Atlantic States through the International Commission for the Accreditation of Professional Genealogists (ICAPGen). She loves working with clients and specializes in U.S. genealogical research, writing personal and family histories, and preparing genealogical information for publication. She currently serves as president of the Utah Genealogical Association, and she is the lead genealogist for the award-winning television series, Relative Race.

#### **PUBLICATION NEWS**

### American Ancestors and NGS Magazine

There are two national associations that publish quarterly magazines covering many topics of interest to researchers. One is *American Ancestors* by the New England Historic Genealogical Society. The other is the *NGS Magazine* published by the National Genealogical Society.

Some current articles of interest include from *American Ancestors*: "Using DNA to Identify My Grandmother's Mother", "A Clubwoman's Letters: Middle-Class Feminism in the Early 1900's", "A Glimpse into the Early Life of Pilgrim Sara (Reader) Cushman form Lenham, Kent, 1585-1616", and "Exploring Our Digital Records from Home".

Also from the NGS Magazine there are articles about Germanic family history research, identities of transported convicts, the accuracy of online family trees, almshouse records, Federal bankruptcy records and records of old soldiers' homes.

The Napa Valley Genealogical library receives both of these publications. The most current issues are kept on the desk near the computers. When you are in the library take a look to see what you may find that could assist your research.

The library is currently open on Wednesdays and the 1st and 3rd Saturdays from 10 am to 1 pm.

## Mare Island Cemetery

In 2021 a group of volunteers completed the restoration and documentation of the Mare Island Naval Cemetery located at the south end of Mare Island.

This is the oldest military cemetery on the West Coast and encompasses military burial from 1856 to 1921. The Mare Island Shipyard was closed in 1996 and the cemetery was abandoned.

The Napa Valley Genealogical Society has received a copy of the publication produced at the end of the restoration. There are approximately 900 burials in the cemetery and all have been restored and tombstones replaced based on the burial records. The publication includes photographs of the tombstones and monuments as well as other photographs. But perhaps the greatest value is in the research completed on each burial with historical details of service and descriptions of the circumstances of the death as well as the detailed location of each grave. At the end of the volume there is some history of events at the cemetery since the closure of Mare Island. The publication is indexed making it much easier to research this site.

The volume is in the Library and available for research. Look it up when you are visiting the Library.




