What is a legacy?

- Financial assets: property, investments, wealth
- Physical belongings
- Values, traditions, wisdom
- Acts of kindness...How we made a difference in someone's life
- Life's work
- Love and warm memories left with family and friends

Our family legacy may be reflected in...

- Family research
- Documents
- Photos
- Stories

How do we pass this family legacy on to our loved ones?

- Our family may not be interested at this time
- Our children and grandchildren may be minimalists and not interested in boxes of family stuff
- But we all have a family legacy worth preserving
So it is up to us to curate that legacy for the future

We can do that through our stories

- Stories connect us to our family
- Stories may be more important than the physical things we own
- We can start small
A single photo of an item can easily bring back the memory of that item and the story associated with it
- Although families may not be interested in the physical items that we cherish, they will be interested in our stories and our photos

What do we have that help us tell those stories?

- Family research, books, audio tapes, home movies, photos, slides, photo albums, scrapbooks, journals, diaries, memoirs, yearbooks, postcards, ephemera, heirlooms and furniture

How do we share the stories?

- Create a book
- Post family history on genealogy sites
- Share family history with libraries
- Create a digital legacy

Goal

- Curate the story of our lives, that of our family, and our ancestors
- Bring it together in one place
- Find a place that is safe from natural disaster
- Available for the family when they are interested
- Possibility of existing for 100 years or so
- Preferably not with a monthly or annual subscription that the family would have to maintain

Organize paper photos

Cathi Nelson, Photo Managers recommends the ABC's of photo organization

- A Put photos in an ALBUM or ARCHIVE
- B Put photos in a BOX to keep
- C Put photos in a CAN to toss
- S SHARE the stories

Scanning resolution

- Photos 300 DPI to 600 DPI
- Slides 2000 DPI to 4000 DPI

Aids in scanning large and odd shaped objects

- iPhone
- Photomyne
- Table tripod and a digital camera
- Photographic copy stand
- Professional book scanner

Create a digital photo hub

- Label photos
- Use metadata
